Varadarajan V. Chari has been a professor of economics at the University of Minnesota since 1994. Professor Chari has many accomplishments which include several academic and economic roles. He is currently the Paul W. Frenzel Land Grant Professor of Liberal Arts, Professor of Economics and Founding Director of the Heller-Hurwicz Institute at the University of Minnesota. In 1974, he received a Bachelor of Technology in Chemical Engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay. He received his Ph.D. from Carnegie-Mellon University in 1980. He has served on the Board of Editors of many journals, including *Econometrica*, the *Journal of Economic Literature* and the *Journal of Economic Perspectives*. In 1998, he was elected fellow of the Econometric Society and was named Scholar of the College by the College of Liberal Arts, University of Minnesota in 2008.
